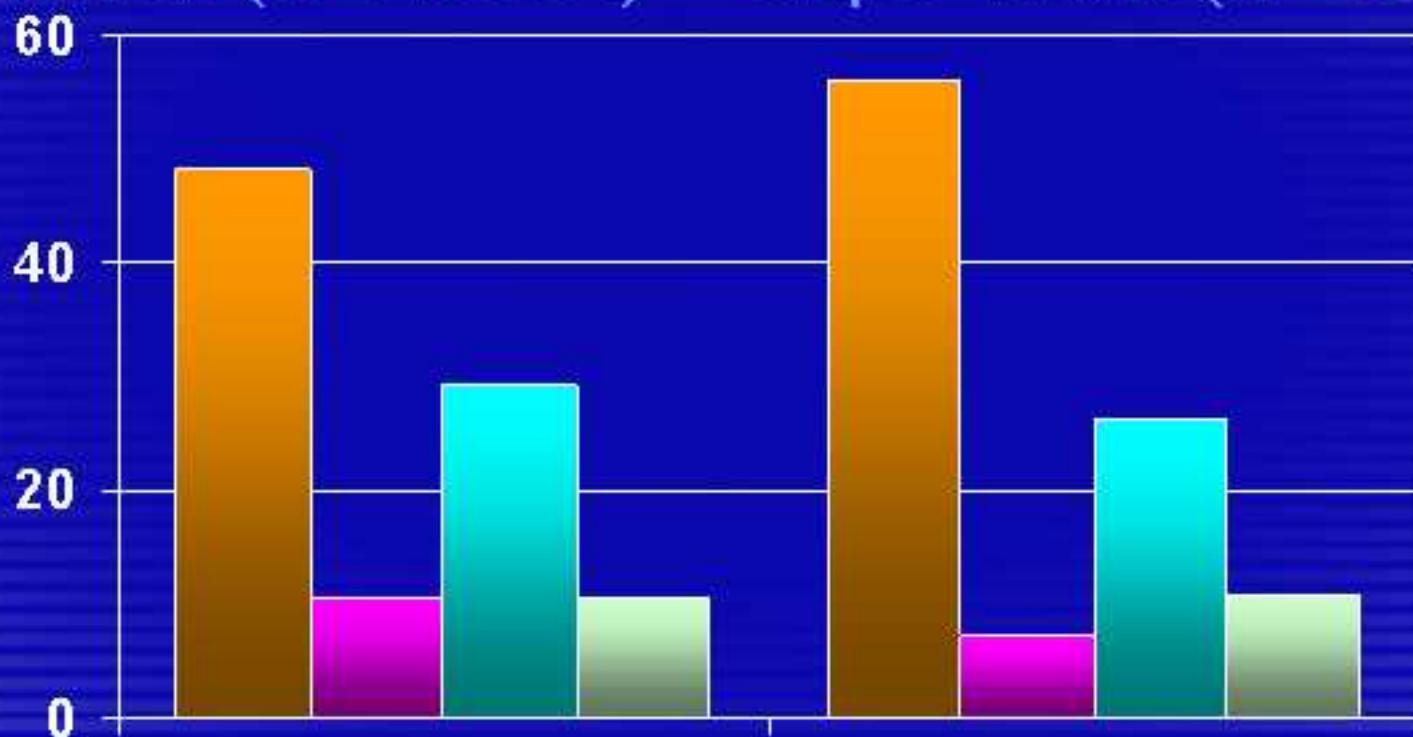


apparent manner of death - proportions

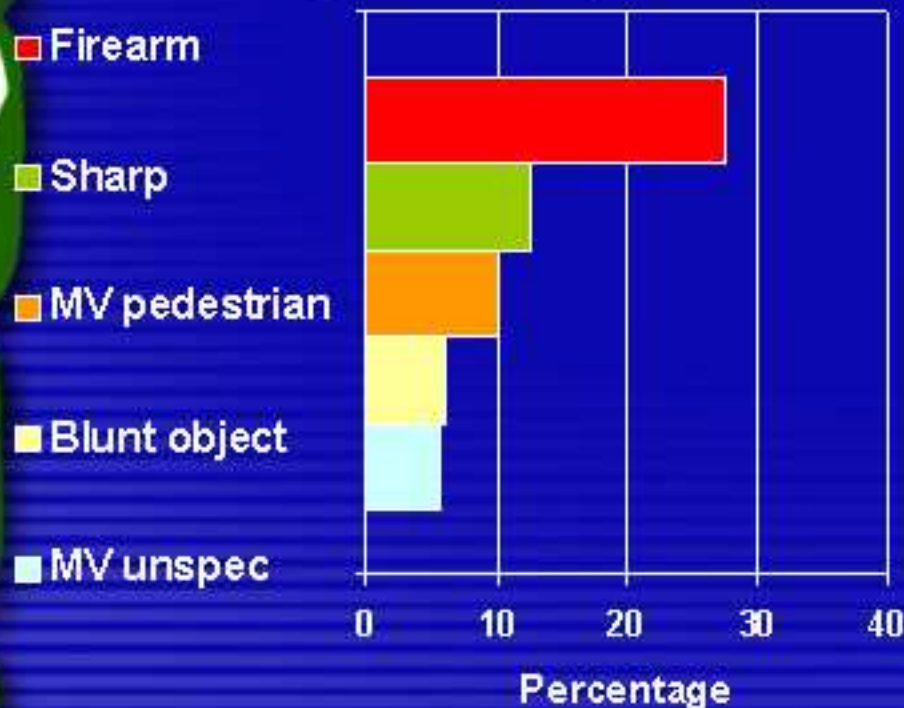

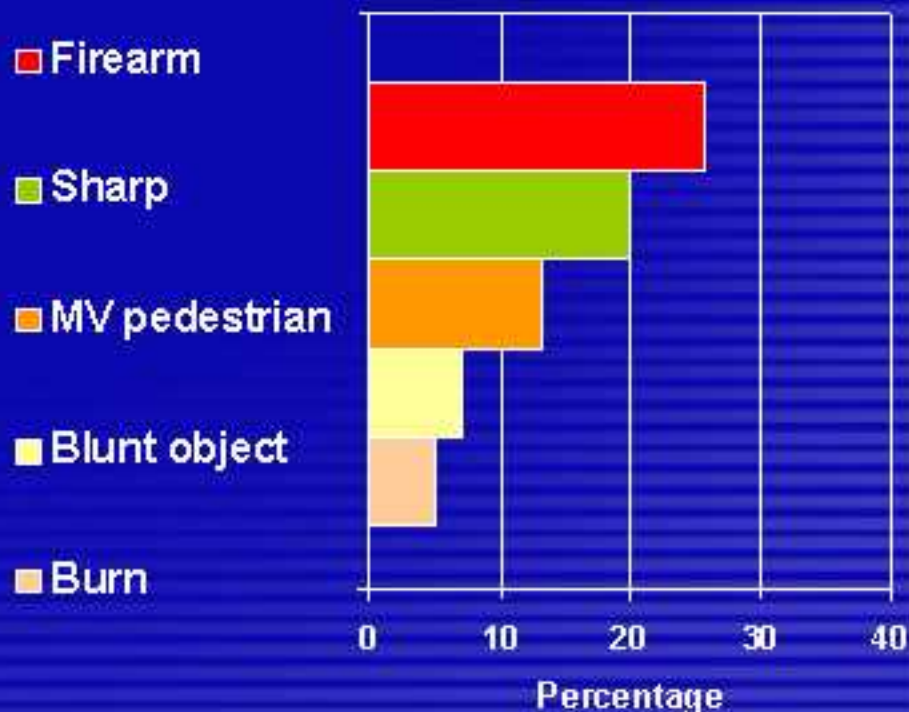

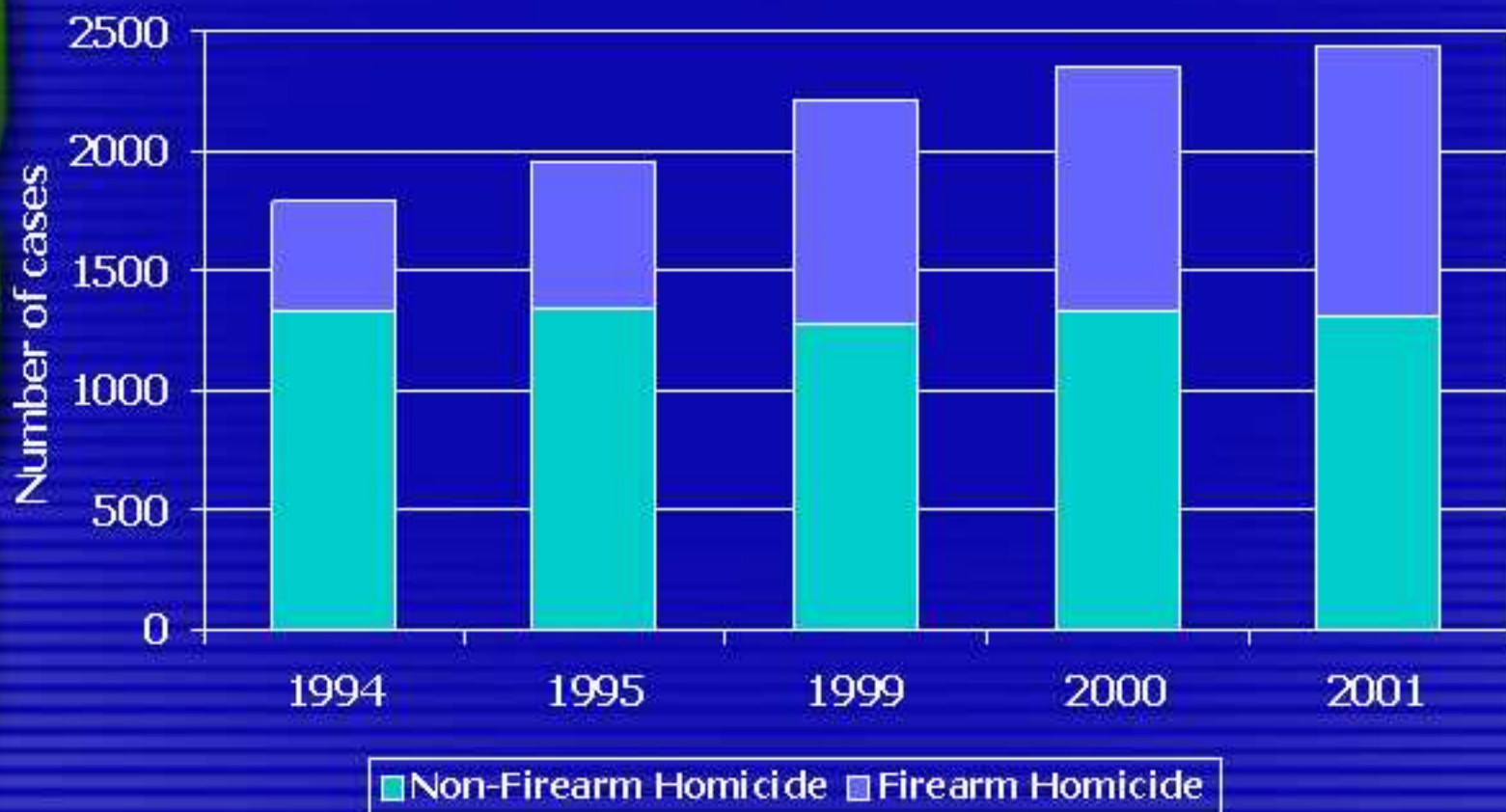

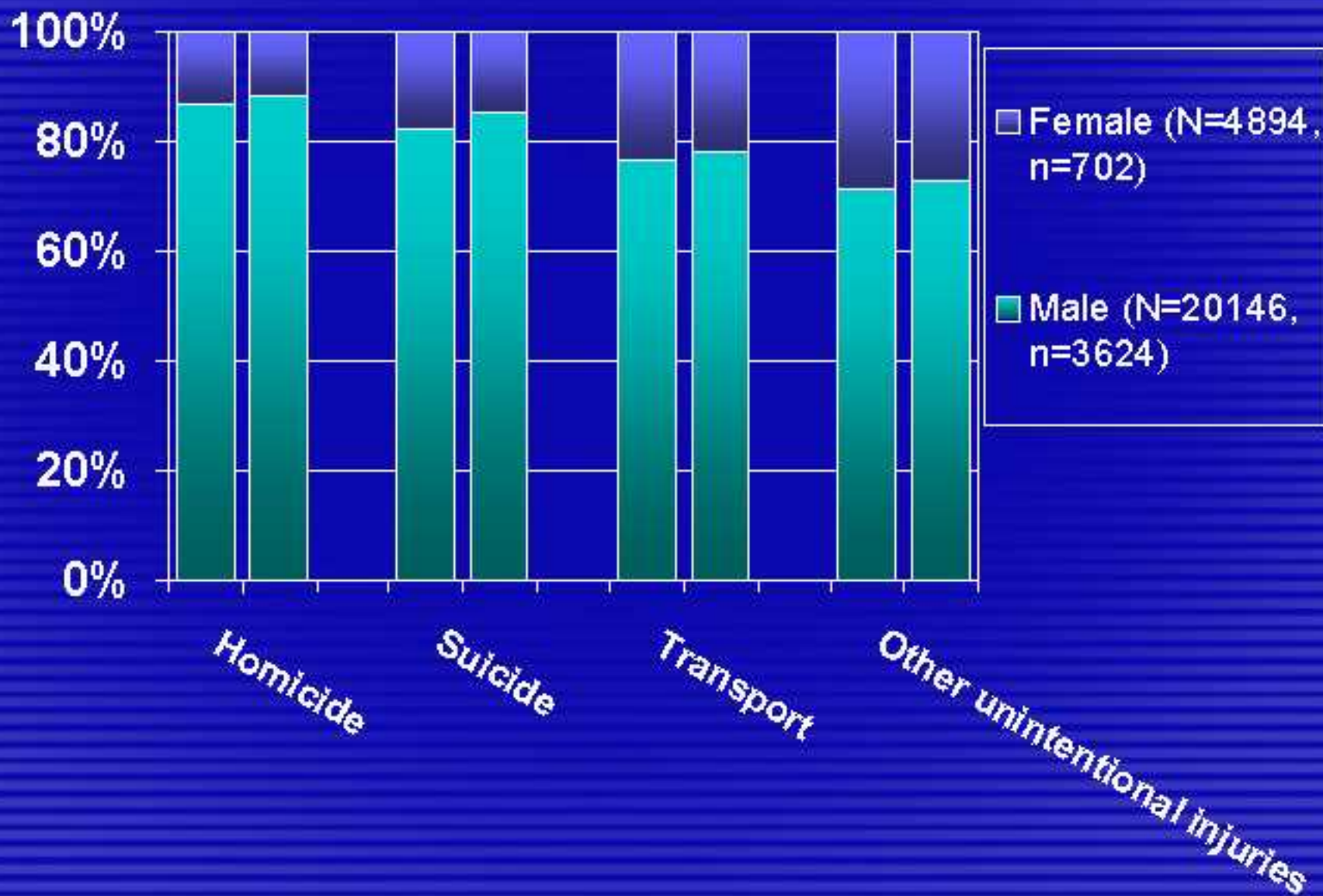

firearm and other homicides - Cape Town 1994 to 2001

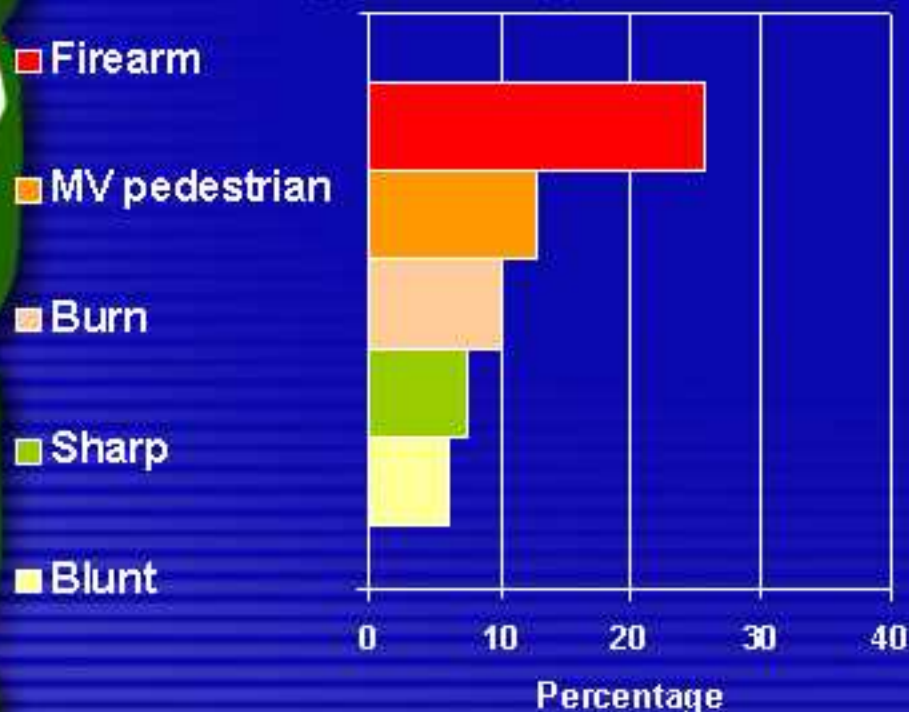

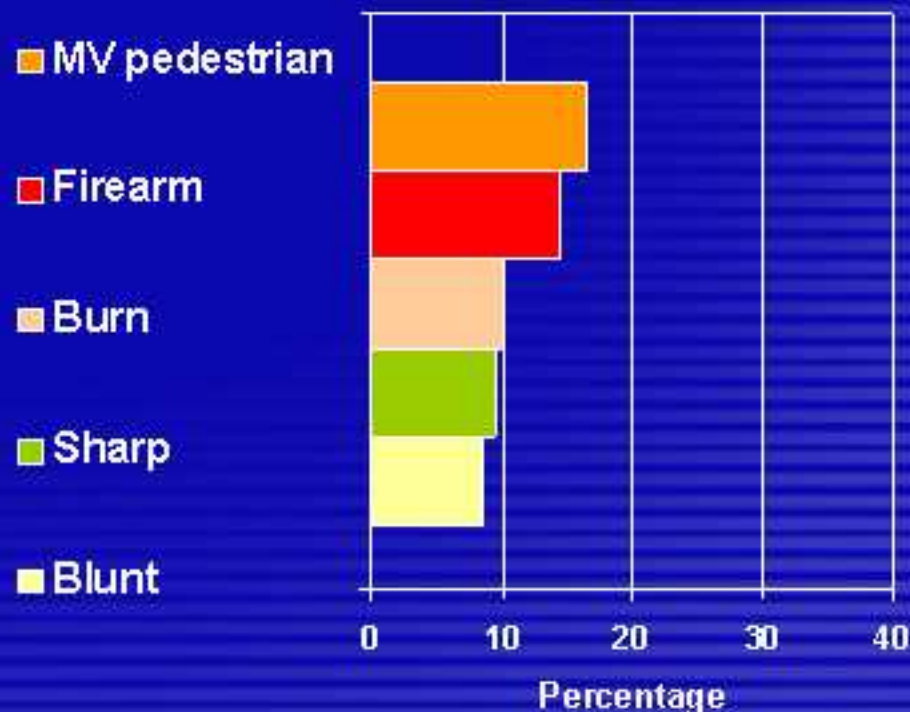


five leading external causes of death - females

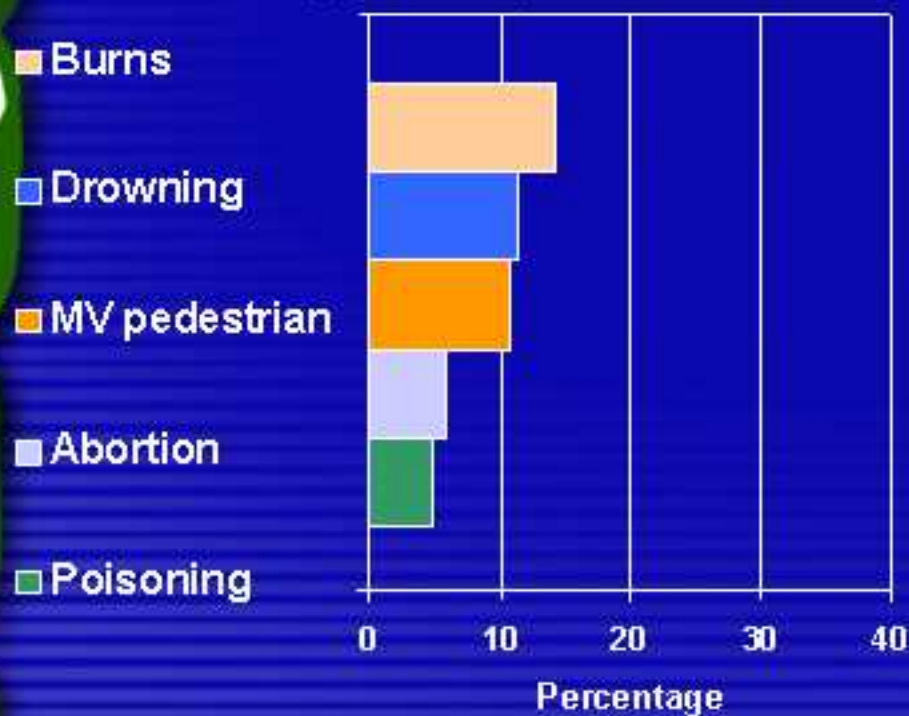


leading external cause of death by age

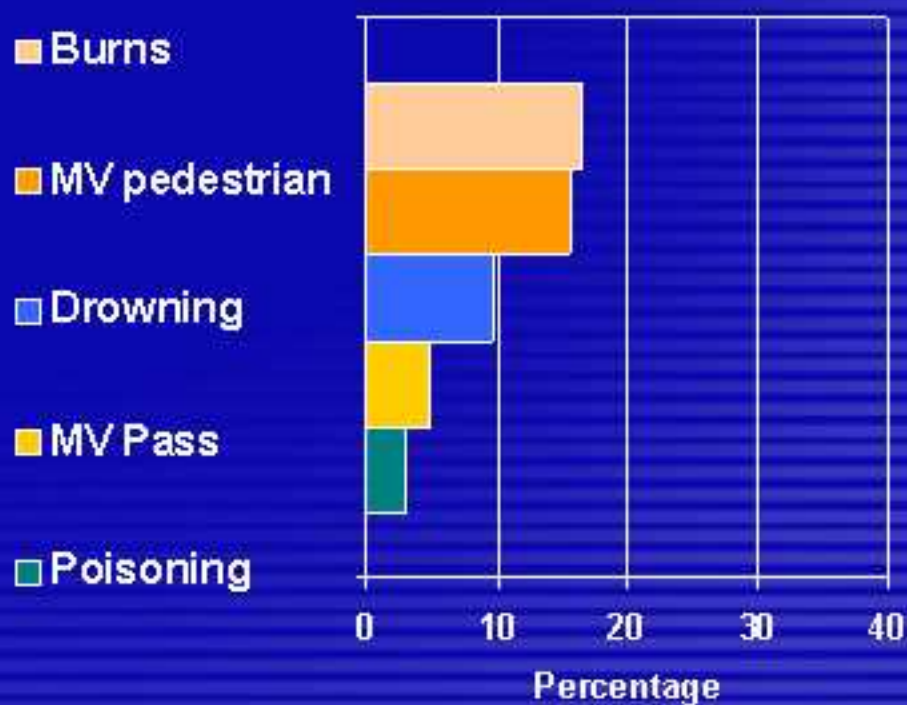
- Age 0 to 4 years - burns

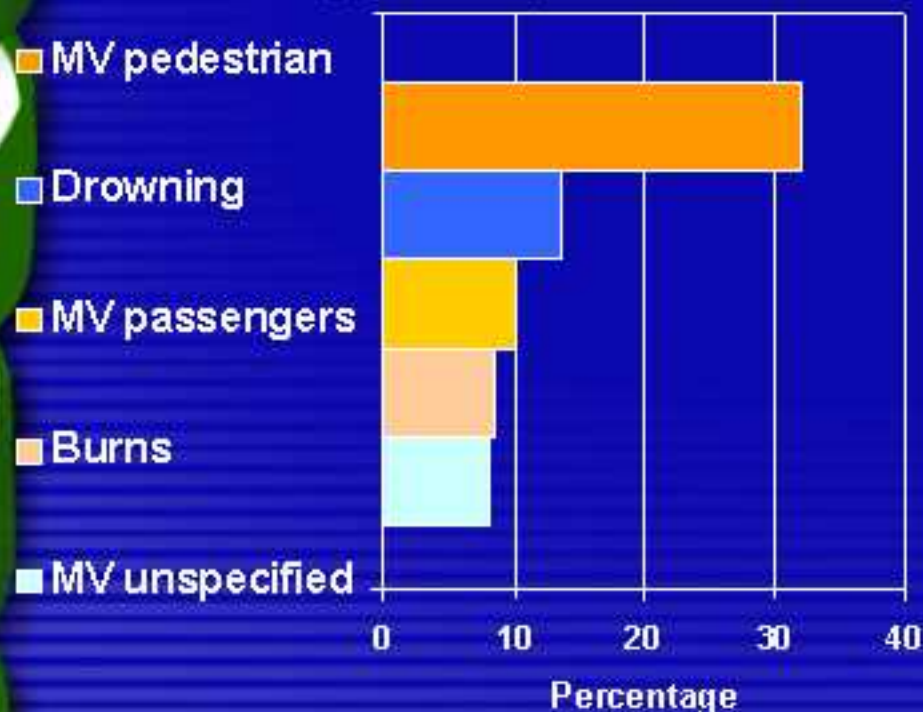

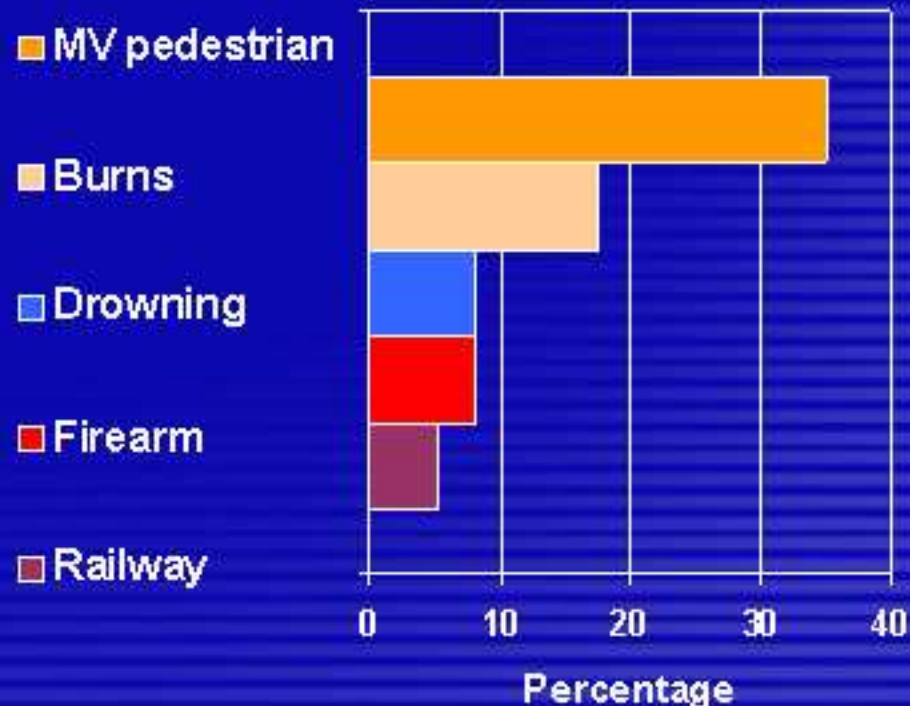


five leading external causes of death - children 5 to 12 years

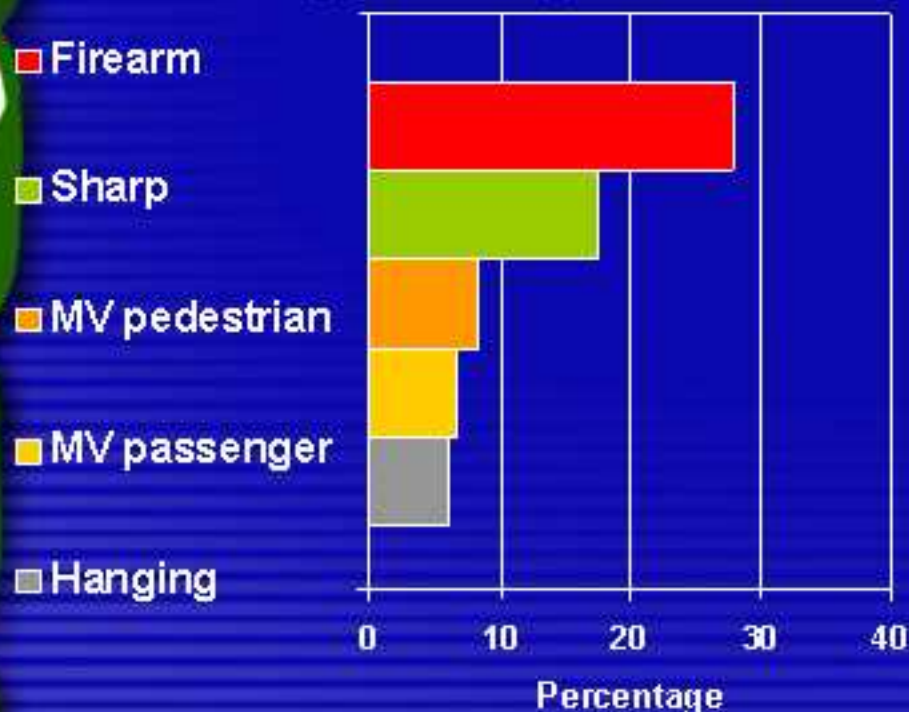
